Summary of purpose and scope of report

The NW London Finance Committee has been meeting since October 2018. In accordance with the memorandum of understanding between the eight CCGs of NW London, the Committee reports back to governing bodies via submissions to the Joint Committee outlining the proceedings of each meeting and highlighting any key decisions made.

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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> NW London CCGs M10 QIPP report 2018/19 NW London CCGs contract report 2018/19 System-wide financial position 2018/19 Update on contracts, QIPP and financial position 2019/20 2019/20 system draft operating plan Harrow CCG recovery plan <p>The Committee agreed to have much leaner agendas in future, and also requested that future agendas be structured to hone in on specific key issues in order to make best use of the Committee’s time.</p> <p>[CHECK THIS IS TRUE!] In its consideration of the contract round and financial position for 2019/20, the Committee acknowledged the scale of challenge in front of the CCGs. A particular one in the short term is the signing of acute contracts – these need to be settled by 21 March to comply with national requirements. However, it is highly likely that signing such contracts will necessitate the CCGs having to agree deficit plans going forward but, at this stage, we cannot be precise about which CCGs or the numbers for each. At the time of writing, the acute deficit for NW London stands in excess of £60m.</p> <p>We are asking the Committee, therefore, to agree that the Accountable Officer is authorised to sign such cross-borough contracts in this context, having taken account of the discussions on the CCG plans at individual Finance Committees.</p> <p>Should the Committee’s agreement be forthcoming, we will seek each Governing Body’s ratification.</p> <p>Further attached to this report is a summary position of NW London finances, which is structured as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Executive summary M10 financial position 2019/20 CCG financial plans summary 2019/20 planning timetable – key dates
