‘Changes to children’s services at Ealing Hospital’



From 30 June 2016 the place where we look after your child in an emergency changes



- ambulances will not take children to A&E at Ealing Hospital



- Ealing Hospital will not have a children's ward. So your child will not be able to stay overnight



- ambulances will take children to another hospital in north west London with a children's A&E



- all day clinics and outpatients appointments for children will still be at Ealing Hospital. Please carry on using them as usual.



When to call an ambulance for your child



- if you are worried your child is very badly ill call 999.



What to do when your child needs care right away but does not need an ambulance



When your child is hurt or ill and needs to be seen right away:



- you can go to Ealing Hospital urgent care centre. It is also called the UCC



- you can call or visit your GP

- you can call NHS 111. This phone line will take your calls all the time.
